KEY INITIATIVES

The tri-board, consisting of AANN, ABNN, and AMWF, focused on a key initiative this past year: a mentorship program.

The mentorship program was developed to address a shortage of mentors for neuroscience nurses at all levels of development in the nursing profession. The goal of this program is to provide neuroscience professionals the opportunity for mentoring in clinical, research, and clinician educator pathways and advice regarding career development. We completed our first round of mentor/mentee pairings and had 10 matches.

AANN also started a new Board Mentorship Program. This program is designed to provide a neuroscience staff nurse the opportunity to sit on the AANN Board of Directors as a mentee and nonvoting member for 1 year. The goal of this program is to help develop and support future AANN leaders by giving the mentee exposure to the board. For more information, please visit the AANN website. Another major accomplishment for AANN was the launch of the SCRN Review Course in our new learning management system. The online course is a self-paced study tool where you can earn up to 8 CE hours upon completion and evaluation of the course. Key interactive features include knowledge checks, correct and incorrect answer descriptions, and videos to emphasize key concepts. OPERATING EXPENSES

We were in good financial standing at the end of 2017 with 6.5 months in reserve. We will continue to maintain the reserves so we can invest in special projects. We also are committed to using our reserves to invest in educational programs, like the LMS, to better serve our members.

Operating revenue for the year was \$3.2 million dollars, and operating expenses for the year totaled \$2.2 million. AANN ended with a positive bottom line, even after investing in the LMS and generating lower profit than expected on advertising, the meeting, and product revenue. Assets continue their upward trend, and in 2017, we ended the year with more than 1.2 million dollars in net assets.

AANN's finances are healthy and we continue to plan for the future. You can be assured that the board always will act in the best interest of our members.
