The American Association of Neuroscience Nurses (AANN), the American Board of Neuroscience Nursing (ABNN), and the Agnes Marshall Walker Foundation (AMWF) present the 2020 Annual Report. Together, we are the three pillars driving neuroscience nursing excellence. This report highlights our accomplishments from March 2020 through April 2021 and looks at our goals for the duration of 2021.

During a difficult year, we kept our mission and strategic plan in mind and made great strides in the areas of membership, engagement, education, and advocacy. We kept the needs of neuroscience nurses at the forefront and found new ways to provide education and support for our members and certificants.

AANN led several initiatives to support its members and all nurses during this time:

- We extended the amount of time members had to renew their membership and pay their dues by 30 days.
- We offered a 20% discount on products during Neuroscience Nurses Week.
- We hosted free monthly webinars offering CE contact hours.
- We allowed students and recent graduates to join AANN for free.
- We collaborated with the American Nurses Association to offer well-being and mental health resources.

The 2020 AANN Annual Meeting theme, *Illuminating Opportunities* in a Time of Change, was a driving force for our work this past year. We had to illuminate opportunities in a time of change and uncertainty when the 2020 Annual Meeting was cancelled due to the coronavirus. AANN pivoted the Stroke Conference and International Neuroscience Nursing Research Symposium (INNRS) in August 2020 to virtual conferences. We were proud to provide dynamic education in a virtual setting for the first time. And in January 2021, AANN hosted the inagural Neuroscience Advanced Practice Provider Educational Meeting as a virtual event.

During a difficult 2020, ABNN supported certificants by launching a certification toolkit. This toolkit includes education about the benefits of certification and sample letters to leadership to help make the case for certification. They also added a fourth exam window in 2020 and allowed applicants to postpone their exam window because of COVID. ABNN is currently investigating options for remote proctoring and hopes to have more information available soon.

AMWF supported neuroscience nurses by creating a membership grant to cover the cost of membership dues and continued to provide grants for research, leadership, and educational pursuits.

Education:











2020 Operating Trends
