5th Annual International Neuroscience Nursing Research Symposium (August 7-8, 2021) Virtual Meeting

Abstract Submission Deadline: Monday, April 12, 2021 at 11:59 PM (CST) Late submissions will not be accepted. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS.

The International Neuroscience Nursing Research Symposium (INNRS) Symposium PlanningCommittee invites applications to present at the 5th Annual Symposium.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

By submitting an abstract, you agree to the following stipulations if the abstract is chosen:

- All abstracts must be submitted in English.
- Abstracts <u>MUST BE BLINDED</u> and must not refer to the organization, author, or location, in the title, presenter information, abstract text, etc. Any unblinded abstracts will be immediately disqualified.
- Each section of the abstract submission form must have a completed entry. Any incomplete abstracts will be disqualified.
- All references are required to be in AMA format in the Bibliography section.
- All conference registration costs are paid by the speaker(s).
- The abstract title, speaker information (including credentials) and abstract
 descriptions will appear in all conference materials exactly as submitted. No title
 changes can be made once the abstract has been submitted. Submitters are
 asked to determine the final title, proofread the application for typographical
 errors, and verify the accuracy of the speaker listings, abstract title, and content
 before the abstract is submitted.
- The poster presenter will be responsible for meeting all deadlines and requirements regarding the abstract. The poster presenter is responsible for notifying AANN Staff of any changes, additions, or corrections in poster presenter or co-author names, poster titles or availability to present the submitted poster at the assigned date and time. Unless otherwise noted on the abstract, the poster presenter will be considered the only contact.

POSTER PRESENTATION FORMAT

Poster Presenter:

 Presenters are assigned specific poster session times to present their poster and answer questions posed by colleagues during the conference. The poster presentation will be of research, QI, education, or leadership findings by anindividual or representatives of a team.

EXPERTISE LEVELS

Classify the session according to attendee expertise levels, not the level of the presenter:

- Beginner: New to the field, topic or to the care of acute and critically ill patients.
- <u>Intermediate:</u> Has worked in the field and has proficient skills in research and practice pertaining to care of acute and critically ill patients.
- <u>Expert:</u> Has special knowledge or ability and performs skills that exceed a proficient nurse at an intermediate level.
- Advanced: Has acquired advanced preparation for expanded clinical practice
 with minimum of a master's degree. Clinical nurse specialists, nurse practitioners,
 nurse anesthetists and nurse midwives are considered advanced practice
 nurses.

PRESENTER TITLES

- <u>Poster Presenter:</u> Is the main poster presenter of a submitted abstract and will attend the meeting and present the poster.
- <u>Author(s)</u>: Are individuals who contribute data, educational planning, or research towards the submitted abstract, but will <u>not</u> be attending the meeting.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Review and Selection:

Each abstract will be evaluated through a blinded peer review process by members of the Symposium Planning Committee. Notification of abstract selection or non-selection willbe made by the end of May 2021.
